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The workshop was intended to present in detail the contents of Module 5 “External support and cooperation” as well as to discuss about the coordination of the next virtual meeting to be held on March, 25.

The introductory workshop took place on March, 11 2013 at USR Veneto (Venice).

Camilla Tamiozzo, USRV representative, warmly welcomed the teachers and presented the workshop agenda.



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After this introduction Camilla Tamiozzo made a presentation on Module 5. She described the structure of the module and main sections in order to facilitate teachers' work.

The presentation was intended to begin a round table with teachers on Module 5. During the discussion teachers had the opportunity to provide their opinions and points of view taking into account the situation within their own schools and the experiences carried out.

In the last part of the introductory workshop, Camilla Tamiozzo invited teachers to discuss about the arrangement of the next virtual meeting. According to the project proposal, USRV will be the moderator. As for the previous virtual meetings, USRV identified a school that will be in charge of coordinating the discussion and presenting the main results of the training on Module 5. The school will be "IPSIA C. Scarpa" (vocational school) and the spokesperson will be Ms. Daniela Perotto. In order to facilitate the speaker's role, teachers agreed on sending to the spokesperson a summary of their opinions within one week.

The introductory workshop was also aimed at setting up the main steps and procedures to be carried out during the virtual meeting. All teachers provided their suggestions and opinions. Finally all participants agreed on the main decisions taken and USRV will send the virtual meeting agenda and the presentations given by the other partners in order to let Daniela Perotto and her colleagues make a synthesis and pose appropriate questions to participants.



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
